	 4. Learn the Guide to Pronunciation. If you immediately jump into using the dictionary without understanding the pronunciation guide, it can be difficult to figure it out. 5. Read the Guide Words. These are the two words at the top of each page that show the first and last 	
	entries on the page. These words will help you find the word you are looking for in the right letter section. 6. Read the Definitions. Once you find an entry, you can find the exact meaning of the word, its pronunciation, part of speech, synonyms, antonyms, and probably its origin.
